November 17, 2009 (Fayetteville, NC) - On 17-18 November 2009, attendees of the Fort Bragg Soldier Equipment and Technology Conference held at the Crown Expo in Fayetteville, North Carolina were able to run tests and participate in demonstrations of the XD-2i Explosives Trace Detector. Soldiers from Fort Bragg and their support contractors were able to see an explosives trace detector capable of detecting trace explosives residue off hands, cell phones, clothes, knives, identification, wallets, etc. The Fort Bragg expo also enabled Soldiers and their support contractors to provide direct feedback regarding what's working, what isn't, and what is needed in future products for soldiers down range.

The XD-2i explosives detector was well received. Soldiers were most impressed to learn that this explosives trace detector's could detect in a single sample, commercial and military and homemade explosives (HME) regardless of operational environment or user experience and without warm up, calibration, or clear down delays after detection. Soldiers were equally impressed that the XD-2i weighed less than 2 pounds, could operate on AA batteries, wouldn't become overwhelmed and unusable after being exposed to bulk explosives, and with its ease of use.
